



SAFE SCHOOL POLICY

Using student feedback from the Survey of Engagement and Wellbeing, which is conducted annually in our school to all Year 8 & 9 students. Students reported...

All verbal, social, physical and cyber victimisation decreased in 2017 from the 2016 results.

*Safety at Findon High School is **important**. We value each student and believe in supporting them to achieve their best in a secure, safe and caring environment.*

Student Responsibilities

If you are experiencing bullying or harassment, **report it. Don't ignore it.**

- **Tell the person** who is bullying you to stop it. Tell them their behaviour is hurtful.
- **Choose not to bully others.** Stand up respectfully for yourself and others.
- **Seek help** by talking to someone you trust.
- **Report and inform staff** such as a teacher or school leader.
- Support the person being bullied.
- Don't stand and watch. Get help from an adult.
- Make it clear that you and your friends disapprove of bullying.
- If you know of bullying let a teacher know.
- If someone you know is being bullied, or you are a bystander who observes or hears a bullying incident, your behaviour becomes part of the problem.
- Care enough to do something, even if it doesn't affect you personally.

*Education around **Digital Citizenship** is also something we take seriously at Findon High School.*

- **Think before you post!**

If continuing harassment occurs there are consequences including:

1. Restorative meeting, to restore the relationship
2. Detention/parents informed
3. Possible suspension
4. Exclusion - and / or police involvement



Staff Responsibilities

- Establishing safe, supportive relationships and therefore learning environments.
- Delivery of programs which support inclusivity and diversity.
- Encouragement of students to use the **Tell, Seek, Report** process.
- Responding to, and follow up, all concerns expressed by students, families and other staff.
- Implementation of restorative strategies to manage inappropriate behaviour and resolve conflict.
- Maintain a confidential approach to any concerns.
- If bullying is occurring, intervene and if needed inform Leadership Staff

Leadership Responsibilities (Staff and Students)

- Ensure all staff, students and families are familiar with the Safe School policy.
- Support staff to respond to, and follow up concerns.
- Respond to, and follow up all concerns expressed by staff, students and families.
- Organise Restorative Meetings as required.
- Ensure all staff/students receive appropriate reminders regarding the Safe School policy.
- Be positive role models.
- Create social activities that promote respectful behaviour.

Parent / Guardian Responsibilities

- Watch for signs of distress and report any safety concerns.
- Listen to your child.
- Advise and support your child.
- Work with the school for positive outcomes.

Strategies / Current Practices

Findon High School is a safe place to learn. We use a range of prevention and intervention strategies. These include:

- Teaching about relationships, diversity, empathy and safety through our Life Long Learning program.
- Developing policies that promote student safety through a continual process of reflection and review.
- Providing opportunities to help students participate and have their say.
- Counselling students and families and linking them to community/ intervention programs and services to promote wellbeing.
- Putting logical consequences in place to support positive behaviours.
- Holding Restorative conferences to ensure positive outcomes for victims and support to learn and move forward.
- School Camps, VET programs, Community/Intervention programs.
